

Policy for Primary sports and PE premium

The Primary sports and PE premium was first allocated to pupils in 2013-14. This Premium is allocated to local authorities and delegated to schools during the summer term. The premium is focussed on further enhancing pupil's achievement in sport and encouraging healthy life styles.

Schools will have the freedom to spend the Premium, which is additional to the underlying schools budget, in a way they think will best support the enhancement of pupil's achievement in sport and encouraging healthy life styles. The targeted and strategic use of the primary sports and PE premium will support us in achieving our vision.

Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
- In making provision for pupils, we recognise that no Castle pupils will make the nationally expected progress.
- We reserve the right to allocate the funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as not making nationally expected progress.
- Sports premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children will be in receipt of the premium / interventions at one time.
- Premium resources may also be used to target able children on Free School Meals.

Provision

The range of provision the *Governors* consider making for this group could include:

- Providing small group work with an experienced staff member focussed on overcoming gaps in learning
- 1-1 support
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through coaches, additional resources and educational visits to sporting venues.

Reporting

- It will be the responsibility of the Headteacher, or a delegated member of staff, to produce regular reports for the Governing Body
- The progress made towards narrowing the gap, by year group, for socially disadvantaged pupils
- An outline of the provision that was made since the last meeting
- An evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support
- The Governors of the school will ensure that there is an annual statement to parents on how the Premium funding has been used to address the issue of 'narrowing the gap', for pupils unable to attain the nationally expected levels of progress. This task will be carried out within the requirements published by the Department for Education and will appear on our school website

Appeal

Any appeals against this policy will be through the governor's complaints procedure

Primary sports and PE Premium Report for 2017-18

Amount-Our allocation for Primary sports and PE Premium Pupil 2017-18 was £16,080

Expenditure-This expenditure is being used to support the teaching of Primary table tennis as a sport. Three new permanent static table tennis tables and associated equipment are to help develop this sport. Additional monies are being used for further outdoor resources for the primary area.

Impact-Pupils will be able to review and refine their table tennis skills and ensure they remain as active as possible during break times.

Sustainability- The equipment is well looked after, stored securely and has special protective tops!

Primary sports and PE Premium Report for 2016-17

Amount-Our allocation for Primary sports and PE Premium Pupil 2016-17 was £6791.

Expenditure-This expenditure was used to purchase ICT equipment to enhance pupil's physical performance. Ipad's have been purchased alongside other equipment so that pupils can record and improve performances. The remainder of the money was used to provide further sports and PE training for our primary teachers and fund alternative sporting venues to enable primary pupils to access a wider range of sports and increase the range of outdoor equipment available to our pupils.

Impact-Pupils are able to review and refine their movements thus improving their physical abilities.

Sustainability- The equipment is well looked after, stored securely and has special protective cases! The training for staff will continue to have an impact in years to come.

Primary sports and PE Premium Report for 2015-16

Amount-Our allocation for Primary sports and PE Premium Pupil 2015-2016 was £3792.

Expenditure- This money was used to purchase additional equipment for use with the new multi-use games area (MUGA).

Impact- Pupils have access to a wider range of sporting activities, equipment and experiences. This has increased their growing interest in sports and eases the transition to secondary PE / sports.

Sustainability- The equipment is used and stored securely by our qualified and experienced PE Teacher.
