

Policy for Primary sports and PE premium

The Primary sports and PE premium was first allocated to pupils in 2013-14. This Premium is allocated to local authorities and delegated to schools during the summer term. The premium is focussed on further enhancing pupil's achievement in sport and encouraging healthy life styles.

2018/19	£16,275
2017/18	£12,390

Schools will have the freedom to spend the Premium, which is additional to the underlying schools budget, in a way they think will best support the enhancement of pupil's achievement in sport and encouraging healthy life styles. The targeted and strategic use of the primary sports and PE premium will support us in achieving our vision.

Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
- In making provision for pupils, we recognise that no Castle pupils will make the nationally expected progress.
- We reserve the right to allocate the funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as not making nationally expected progress.
- Sports premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children will be in receipt of the premium / interventions at one time.
- Premium resources may also be used to target able children on Free School Meals.

Provision

The range of provision the *Governors* consider making for this group could include:

- Providing small group work with an experienced staff member focussed on overcoming gaps in learning
- 1-1 support
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through coaches, additional resources and educational visits to sporting venues.

Reporting

- It will be the responsibility of the Headteacher, or a delegated member of staff, to produce regular reports for the Governing Body
- The progress made towards narrowing the gap, by year group, for socially disadvantaged pupils
- An outline of the provision that was made since the last meeting
- An evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support
- The Governors of the school will ensure that there is an annual statement to parents on how the Premium funding has been used to address the issue of 'narrowing the gap', for pupils unable to attain the nationally expected levels of progress. This task will be carried out within the requirements published by the Department for Education and will appear on our school website

Appeal

Any appeals against this policy will be through the governor's complaints procedure

Primary sports and PE Premium Report for 2019-20

Amount-Our allocation for Primary sports and PE Premium Pupil 2019-2020 is estimated to be £16,210.

Expenditure-This expenditure is to be used:

- Purchase outdoor portable equipment for use at break times and lunchtimes (during this period of limited outdoor space)
- This money is going to be used to purchase a permanent fixed outdoor gym for the primary outdoor space.

Impact- Pupils will continue to engage with and enjoy participating in daily sports activities (even during a time of restricted outdoor space).

Sustainability-The equipment will be well looked after and stored securely.

The outdoor gym equipment is specially coated for the outdoor environment.

Primary sports and PE Premium Report for 2018-19

Amount-Our allocation for Primary sports and PE Premium Pupil 2018-19 was estimated to be £16,275.

Expenditure-

- Additional funding was going to be used to hire qualified sports coaches to work with the teachers or extend current opportunities.
- The remainder of the funding was to be used for additional sports resources.

Impact-Pupils have access to a wider range of sporting activities, equipment and experiences. This will increase their growing interest in sports and eases the transition to secondary PE/sports.

Sustainability- Where this involves equipment to be bought, the equipment is used and stored securely by our qualified and experienced PE Teacher

Primary sports and PE Premium Report for 2017-18

Amount-Our allocation for Primary sports and PE Premium Pupil 2017-18 was £12,390.

Expenditure-This expenditure was used to support the teaching of Primary table tennis as a sport. Three new permanent static table tennis tables and associated equipment are to help develop this sport. Additional monies were used for further outdoor resources for the primary area.

Impact-Pupils are able to review and refine their table tennis skills and ensure they remain as active as possible during break times.

Sustainability- The equipment is well looked after, stored securely and has special protective tops!
